Once you have drawn a whole, create a banging distraction and use your pickaxe to start your tunnel. After you have created your tunnel, use mattresses to stop the sounds.

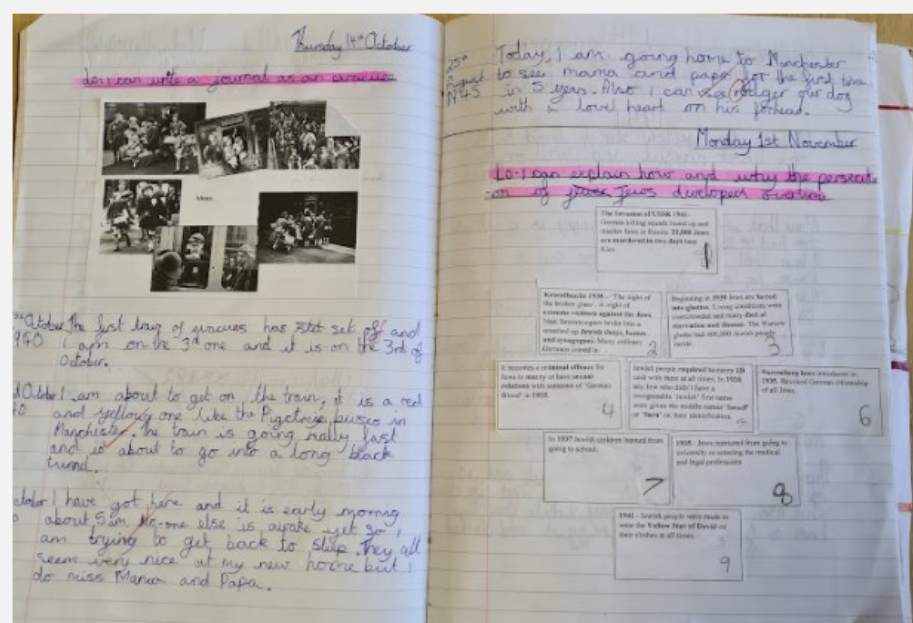
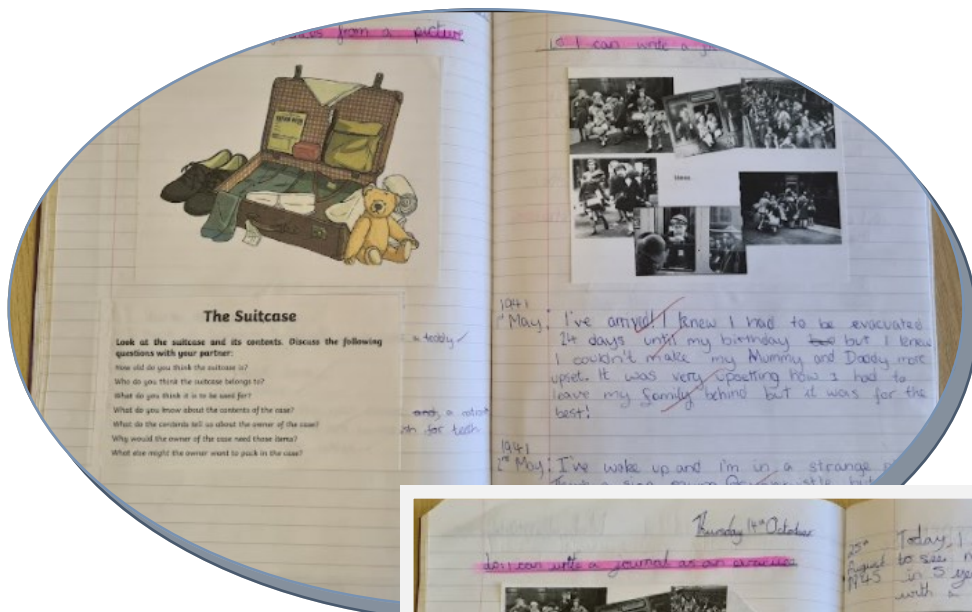
Then crawl through the tunnel with your troops. Once you get out get dressed in your German uniform and use your passport to escape.

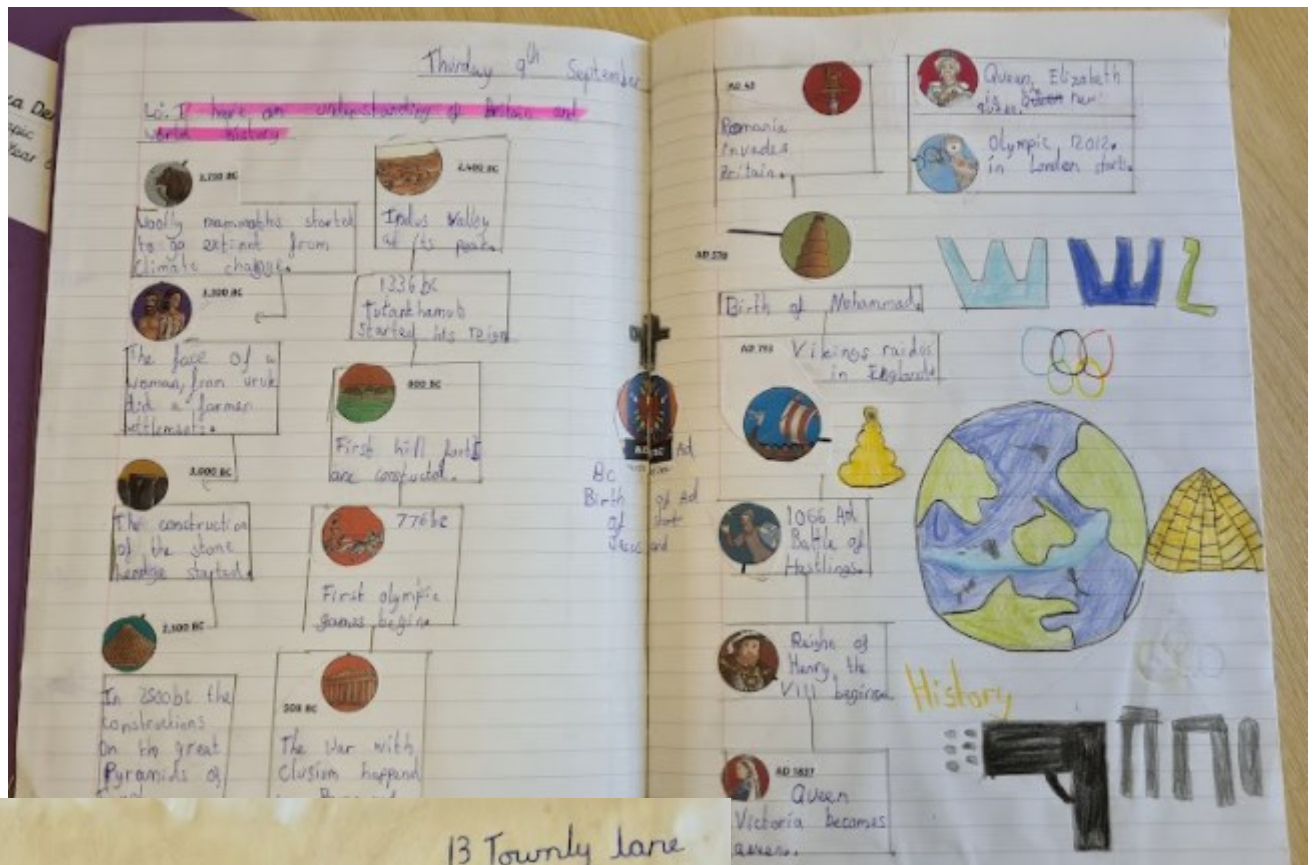

Li. Using knowledge of weights and measures to calculate the amounts a child could eat for a week during food rationing in World War 2

Food	Weight	How could this be eaten? - do the maths!
Bacon	150g (50g per rasher)	$150 \div 3 = 50g$ 3 rashers
Jam	115g (20g per portion)	$115 \div 20 = 5 \frac{1}{4}$ portions 15g extra
Meat	175g 3 x chicken breast = 850g	$175 \div 2 = 87.5$ 2 meals
Sugar	225g (4g per tea spoon)	$225 \div 4 = 56g$ 1g left
Eggs	3	Scramble egg
Milk	3 pints (1 glass = 1/2 pint)	$3 \div \frac{1}{2} = 6$ 12 glasses
Butter	50g (1 slice = 5g)	$50 \div 5 = 10$ 10 slices
Sweets	75g 1 sweet = 5g	$75 \div 5 = 15$ 15 sweets
Cheese	115g (1 slice = 20g)	$115 \div 20 = 5 \frac{1}{4}$ 5 slices
Margarine	55g (1 slice = 5g)	15g extra $55 \div 5 = 11$
