Early Years Foundation Stage Statements

In Pre School

- Explore different materials freely, to develop their ideas about how to use them and what to make
- Develop their own ideas and then decide which materials to use to express them
- Join different materials and explore different textures
- Explore colour and colour-mixing

In Reception:

- Explore, use and refine a variety of artistic effects to express their ideas and feelings.
- Return to and build on their previous learning, refining ideas and developing their ability to represent them
- Create collaboratively, sharing ideas, resources and skills

Early Learning Goals:

- Safely use and explore a variety of materials, tools and techniques, experimenting with colour, design, texture, form and function

On completion of Foundation Stage, a young artist at Moor End will:

- Be eager and excited little artists who look forward to art and creative activities
- Asks questions, wonders and experiments with art, e.g. colour mixing
- Be proud of their work and want to share it with others and parents
- Been exposed to a variety of art activities throughout the year as part of adult-led time or in provision
- Able to talk about different techniques they have used, e.g. how they have joined two pieces together

National Curriculum Objectives for KS1

Pupils should be taught:

- To use a range of materials creatively to design and make products
- To use drawing, painting and sculpture to develop and share their ideas, experiences and imagination
- To develop a wide range of art and design techniques in using colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form and space
- About the work of a range of artists, craft makers and designers, describing the differences and similarities between different practices and disciplines, and making links to their own work

On completion of Key Stage 1, a young artist at Moor End will:

- Be eager and excited artists who look forward to experimenting with a range of artistic resources and techniques
- Engage in their art lessons with care, control and self-confidence
- Take pride in their work
- Able to confidently talk about and share ideas with friends and teachers
- Have the opportunities to use a range of tools and materials, developing their skills, knowledge and accuracy

- To create sketch books to record their observations and use them to review and revisit ideas
- To improve their mastery of art and design techniques, including drawing, painting and sculpture with a range of materials [for example, pencil, charcoal, paint, clay]
- About great artists, architects and designers in history

On completion of Key Stage 2, a young artist at Moor End will:

- Expressive and creative
- Ability to use a range of tools and materials confidently, accurately and safely
- Independently select the tools and materials needed to achieve their desired effect , e.g. oil pastels, drawing pencils, paints, water colours
- Take pride, care and time in creating a high-quality sketch book, showcasing various artistic skills
- To be proud of their achievements
- Have a strong knowledge of a range of great artists and are able to apply their artistic qualities and skills into their work
